## Patient Instructions Steroid Injections

Dr. Cole has injected your joint in order to reduce the pain and inflammation that you are experiencing. Please note that not everyone will have a lasting response following the injection. Here is some information that he would like you to have:

 Content The injection consists of two

> medications: Cortisone (a steroid) and Lidocaine (numbing agent)

 Post-injection Instructions It is recommended that you refrain

from any high level activities using the joint or limb that was injected

for approximately 48 hours.

Possible Side-effects

 Skin discoloration Individuals with dark complexions

> may experience some skin discoloration locally at the site of

the injection.

 Steroid Flare-up There is also the possibility of an

increase in discomfort within 48 hours of the injection. This is called a "steroid flare-up." To avoid this, abide by the activity

restriction above.

 Infection Finally, there is a small chance of

infection (less than 1%). If you notice any of these signs or symptoms, you should contact Dr. Cole's office immediately at
